SITREP COVERING PERIOD 090000Z FEB TO 100000Z FEB 94.

I. GEN SITUATION: CALM. ON 091330 FEB 94 TWO CHILDREN WERE PLAYING WITH A GRENADE NEAR THE CND COMPOUND. THE GRENADE EXPLODED AFTER A WHILE AND THE SEVERELY INJURED CHILDREN WERE BROUGHT TO KIGALI HOSPITAL BY CIVILIANS. ON 092000 FEB 94 THERE WAS A DISPUTE AMONG LOCALS AT THE KICUKIRU AREA. THE INCIDENT ENDED IN THROWING A GRENADE TO ONE OF THEM. THE INJURED PERSON, BEING A MEMBER OF THE GENDARMERIE, WAS TAKEN TO KIGALI HOSPITAL FOR TREATMENT. ON 092145 FEB 94 A WOMAN WAS DRIVING WITH HER CAR FROM NYAMIRAMBO AREA TO BILYOGO. SHE WAS STOPPED BY SOME PEOPLE WHO WANTED TO USE THE CAR FOR THE EVACUATION OF A BEATEN INJURED PERSON TO THE HOSPITAL. SHE COULD ESCAPE FROM THE SPOT, BUT HER CAR WAS BADLY DAMAGED. AT 21.30 HRS A ROAD BLOCK WAS ESTABLISHED BY LOCALS IN THE GITEGA AREA. GENDARMERIE CLEARED THE ROAD BLOCK AT 23.30 HRS.

II. FACTIONAL ACTIVITIES.

A. POLITICAL: BROAD BASED TRANSITIONAL GOVERNMENT NOT YET INSTALLED. SRSG CONTINUES TO PURSUE ALL EFFORTS TO UNBLOCK THE POLITICAL SITUATION. A SECOND ALL PARTY WORKING SESSION IS ORGANIZED TODAY 10 FEB 94 AT UNAMIR HQ.

B. MILITARY:

(1) RGF: RGF TROOPS CARRIED OUT PARA DROPPING TRAINING WITH OWN AIRCRAFT. ALSO CARRIED OUT FIRING PRACTICE AT KIMIHURURA FIRING RANGE.

(2) RPF: IT IS REPORTED THAT ON 071100 FEB 94 RPF SOLDIERS AT CND COMPOUND POINTED THEIR WEAPONS TOWARDS RGF AIRCRAFT CARRYING RGF SOLDIERS FOR PARA DROPPING. ALTHOUGH PREVIOUSLY INFORMED OF THEIR PLANNED ACTIVITY AND WARNED ANOTHER SPOT BY UNMO.

(3) OTHERS: NTR.

III. OWN MILITARY ACTIVITIES.

A. HQS: ADVANCE PARTY FROM GHANAIAN BATTALION ARRIVED ON 09 FEB 94 IN THE MISSION AREA. 225 PERSONNEL ARRIVED OUT OF 800. THE BATTALION IS STATIONED IN THE DMZ AREA AT BYUMBA (BYUBAT) AND WILL BE FULLY DEPLOYED BEFORE THE END OF THE MONTH.

B. SECTORS:

(1) KIGALI: SEC KIGALI CONDUCTED VEHICLE AND FOOT PTL IN KIGALI CITY IN ORDER TO ENSURE KIGALI WEAPON SECURE AREA (KWSA). ESTABLISHED 3 CHECK-POINT DUTIES AT DIFFERENT PLACES IN KWSA. PROVIDED 5 UNMO ESCORTS FOR RPF, 1 FOR RGF AND 1 FOR GENDARMERIE. PROVIDED 1 ARMED ESCORT FOR THE PRIME MINISTER AND 2 FOR RPF. SECURED THE LOCATION OF THE RPF BATTALION IN KIGALI CITY, THE PRIME MINISTER'S OFFICE, FORCE HQ, SEC HQ AND KIGALI AIRPORT. DURING THE NIGHT ASSURED PROTECTION OF THE PRIME MINISTER, THE PRIME MINISTER DESIGNATE, THE PRESIDENT OF THE CONSTITUTIONAL COURT, FIVE OPPOSITION MINISTERS AND SRSG.

(2) DMZ: ADVANCE PARTY OF GHANAIAN BATTALION ARRIVED AT 19.00 HRS AT BYUMBA. CONDUCTED ROUTINE PTL WITHIN OAR. CONDUCTED ESCORT FOR AICS TO KINIGI TO DISTRIBUTE FOOD AND MEDICINE TO DISPLACED PEOPLE.

C. MILQB. PROVIDED ESCORT FOR US DIPLOMATS AND FOR UNAMIR PERSONNEL TO GATUNA. CONDUCTED RECCE PTL IN THE MUTARA AND BYUMBA ZONES ON RPF SIDE. STARTED FAMILIARIZATION TRAINING FOR THE 15 UNMOs FROM ZIMBABWE THAT ARRIVED ON 09 FEB 94.

D. UNOMUR. CONDUCTED ROUTINE PTL WITHIN OAR.

V. HUMANITARIAN ACTIVITIES. DMZ PTL TEAM MET TWO RPF OFFICERS BEING IN CHARGE OF RESETTLEMENT OF DISPLACED PEOPLE IN BUTARO AREA. SO FAR AROUND 15,000 PEOPLE RETURNED TO THE AREA. MAIN POINTS OF ENTRY IN THE AREA ARE: RUHANGA (8139) AND GAYINGA (7546). THERE ARE ABOUT TEN CAMPS IN THIS AREA AND THESE PEOPLE NEED URGENT HUMANITARIAN AID (FOOD AND MEDICINES). ICRC ORGANIZED FOOD DISTRIBUTIONS AT NYAWISHONGEZI, RUTONGO, NYACYONGA, RUKOZO, KIVURUGA AND BYUMBA STADIUM.

VII. LOGISTICS. OPERATIONAL SITUATION REMAINS DIFFICULT DUE TO THE LACK OF VEHICLES AND RADIOS. UNTAC VEHICLES ARRIVED AND ARE BEING CHECKED AND DISTRIBUTED.
